EVALUATION

Quantitative, universal scorecard that aligns with submission questions

Scoring of 1-5
Weighting of 1-3
Total score of 100





SELECTION

After evaluation is a choice: accept or shelve

"Accept" simply means there are governments interested in exploring how to implement the idea. Highly scored ideas would be selected, or accepted, to move to the next phase.

All governments and relevant staff interested in testing the idea would be invited to a meeting with the proposer to discuss how to implement the idea further.

Alliance would facilitate a lead government to move forward with developing a scope to test the solution. Other interested governments would either contribute to scoping or follow along in UrbanLeap as the project progresses.






HOW IS THIS BETTER or DIFFERENT?

- Aggregates demand and capacity for solutions = attracts investment and talent
- Connects silos, inspires innovation
- Path of least resistance where are the resources, champions, expertise, use cases for testing this most effectively?
